



Reading Focus

Retrieval questions are questions that have the answer already written in the text. We can look through the text to find the answer. Some questions you can ask your child when they read at home are:

Fiction Text:

- 1. Who is the author?
- 2. Who is the main character?
- 3. How does the character feel?
- 4. Where is the story set?
- 5. What happened in the part you have just read?

Non-Fiction:

- 1. What is the text about?
- 2. What two things have you found out?
- 3. What information has that paragraph given you?

This book is so fun to read with children and the repeated patterns mean it is easy to be sung to any tune you wish.


Beginner Chapter Book:
